MBRC COVID-19 Community Infrastructure Revitalisation Grant

The Moreton Bay Regional Council (MBRC) has opened applications for their Community Infrastructure Revitalisation Grant today. The purpose of this grant is to enable eligible community organisations to revitalise their existing community facilities, in preparation for the return to standard operating conditions, in order to stimulate the local economy through the engagement of local suppliers and contractors.

Who can apply?

Eligible applicants are community organisations that:

- Are based in the Moreton Bay Region and/or can demonstrate that the proposed project will substantially benefit residents of Moreton Bay;
- Have \$20 million public liability insurance.

The following organisation types are **ineligible**:

- For-profit organisations
- Unincorporated community groups
- Individuals
- Government departments and agencies
- Political Groups.

What is an eligible project?

Projects must, where practical, use local contractors and/or suppliers within the Moreton Bay Region to complete the following:

- Facility Maintenance Projects
- Facility renewal projects
- Upgrades to existing community facilities

What would be considered an ineligible project?

The following projects are ineligible:

- Construction of **new** community facilities
- Projects that are on land owned by an individual or ineligible entity (except for Government departments and agencies)

- Projects that do not have consent of the landowner
- Purchase of equipment, unless directly related to the **eligible** project
- Retrospective funding for projects already completed.

How much can you apply for?

Eligible organisations may receive a grant of up to **\$50,000** (GST inclusive) for up to 100% of the project costs. Note, however, that whilst no co-contribution is required, Council may consider part-funding for projects.

What do you need to include in your application?

Applications are open until **27 April, 2020** and must be submitted online via <https://moretonbay.smartygrants.com.au/covid19cir>. Supporting documentation must also be uploaded and includes:

- Copy of most recent audited financial statements
- Quotes for expenditure items >\$500
- Certificate of public liability insurance
- Letter confirming consent of the landowner (where the project is not on Council land)
- Site plans, if required.
